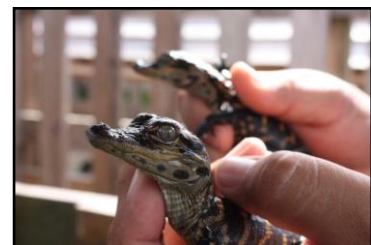
**S**kip across the shallow waters and sawgrass prairie to a distant Miccosukee island as your guides prepare you for a day of natural wonders and cultural discovery! Watch in wonder as great blue herons, egrets, wood storks and ibises take flight as we travel into the true heart of the Florida Everglades. It is here among the sawgrass prairie that remote cypress islands filled with Seminole and Miccosukee history still exist and it is here that our adventure begins ...



Only accessible by airboat, we travel miles into the Everglades to experience two historic Miccosukee island camps. We walk the islands that they once called home to hear how the Miccosukee families for generations learned to live in harmony with what

many considered an unlivable landscape.

Seek out the family of wild gators that live near the big camp. If they care to show themselves, our guide will demonstrate his ability to “speak gator.” To the amazement of all, the gators respond.

<b>Dragonfly Expeditions</b>	<b>The Competition</b>
All entrance fees and taxes included in our flat rate price.	A price with hidden extras, e.g. airboat driver gratuities.
Tour interpretation by guide starts and ends at the hotel.	No guide or interpretation during transfer from the hotel.
Our guides are certified and trained.	Does not provide service from the hotel. If you hire a Step-on-Board guide, they are not certified to any specific standards and are likely self-trained. You never know what you will get.
Maximum number of guests per airboat is 8-20.	Airboats are much larger. Experience is similar to a bus on the water with up to 50 participants on one airboat.
Airboats are custom built, extremely well maintained, quieter and smaller (8-20 seats) than commercial airboats, making them more maneuverable.	Loud and poorly-maintained airboats.
Airboat seats are higher (stadium-style seating) than on commercial airboats, allowing for great visibility for all guests.	Guests sit in flat rows (directly in front of and behind each other), allowing for poor visibility for anyone not in the first row.
Airboat portion of tour explores the traditional home of a Miccosukee family that has lived in the area for generations, creating a culture experience on a reservation.	Simply a roadside tourist attraction designed as a thrill ride, not as a cultural experience.
Airboat ride stops at and explores two tree islands (a hunting camp and a family camp).	Guests do not get off the boats during the airboat ride.
All animals seen on the tour are either wild or being raised to replenish endangered species in the area (no caged animals for show purposes).	Animals are caged for show purposes. Exotic animals are presented as if they were native to the Everglades.
Earmuffs for each participant are supplied.	Toilet paper or cotton balls are supplied.

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
